

## Yom Kippur 101

To All Our Friends in Crested Butte:

It's always fun when Vinotok coincides with the Jewish high holidays, Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur, as it did this year. The Burning of the Grump and casting our individual grumps into the fire closely resemble the "tashlich"—the casting away—of our shortcomings from the past year in Judaism at this the holiest time of year. We take bread crumbs and find a flowing body of water to cast them into. A blast of the shofar (ram's horn) punctuates the cool mountain air as we take personal time to evaluate our lives and rid ourselves of those things about us that we do not want to take into the new year. We all hope that some creatures downstream enjoyed those crumbs. In a world that needs even more connections between cultures and faiths, we warmly wish our Muslim friends and neighbors a sweet new year, as well. The Islamic New Year began the day after Rosh Hashana this year.

Friday night, September 29, at sundown, Jews from all over the world will be fasting, praying and hoping. This is the most solemn of all the Jewish Holy Days. Yom Kippur, "The Day of Atonement" is a time for reflection over the year past and the renewal for the year to come. We fast for 26 hours, and are encouraged to donate the equivalent of any food our family many have consumed to charity. It is a solemn time, filled with communal confessionals and intense personal work.

There are three major things we hope to achieve on Yom Kippur: The first is "T'shuvah," returning, where we hope to overcome our shortcomings and return to a better path. Doing T'shuvah means that when given the opportunity to make the same mistake again, you will choose not to. The Jewish word for sin, is "chet," an archery term, which means "to miss the mark." When we make these mistakes,

when our arrows are not quite true, we are given the chance again to hit the bull's-eye. Our target is to do better and to be better.

"T'fillah," or prayer, is the way we are grateful and humble before God. There are no longer sacrifices brought to the Temple Mount in Jerusalem, our most holy place and the center of Jewish life in the First Century and beyond. We brought the finest grains, the choicest goats or the rarest spices to show our gratefulness to God. Rabbis and sages in the centuries after the second destruction of the Temple created prayer to show our connection to our Creator. Many of these prayers come directly from the Torah, (or "Law"), known as the Five Books of Moses. The melodies for some of the prayers we will sing on Yom Kippur are as ancient as centuries ago and as modern as the year 2017.

"Tzedakah," or righteous giving, is also translated as charity. The word "mitzvah" comes from this very same root and means "commandment." Thus, a boy who becomes a Bar Mitzvah or a girl who becomes Bat Mitzvah is a son or daughter of the commandments, and is responsible from the age of 13 for their own moral choices. During these Days of Awe, we recommit ourselves to the concept of *Tikun Olam*, or repair of the world, through righteous and charitable deeds: taking care of our world, our communities, our families and ourselves.

As we prepare for Yom Kippur, by doing the communally and personally intense work to move beyond the mistakes of the last year, we ask those we may have hurt for their forgiveness. We grant forgiveness to others. And when those difficult conversations have been had, only then can we ask God for forgiveness for ways in which we may have fallen short. We strive to atone—to be "at one"—with each other and

our Creator. In Judaism you are responsible for your own transgressions and we are all responsible for each other.

B'nai Butte, the Jewish community here in the East River Valley, is over 40 years old and like most mountain folks, we run the gamut between formerly observant, never observant, Jewish by heritage, choice or culture, supporting a Jewish partner or friends, or just mildly interested. Everyone is welcome—no matter your background or knowledge (or lack thereof). The prayer book we use is translated and transliterated and very poetic, and we equally embrace Hebrew and English. We have a full slate of services, discussions and more for Yom Kippur, and all are welcome to attend. Jews are not allowed to proselytize—we believe there are many paths to God. We are one of the oldest faiths and cultures, and three great religions have their foundations in Judaism: Christianity, Baha'i and Islam.

We are grateful to Oh Be Joyful and Queen of All Saints Churches for sharing their sacred spaces with B'nai Butte—they have been our support and partners for many years so that we can worship and celebrate. We invite our Crested Butte community to join us as we move into the year to come, fresh with hope and prayer, generosity and forgiveness.
