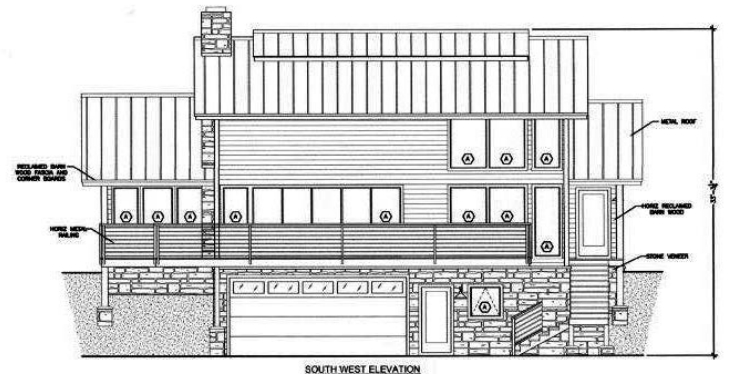

Should the Court determine that the water rights sought to be made absolute cannot be made absolute for any reason, Applicants request a finding of reasonable diligence with respect to any portion not made absolute. All of the tracts in Elk River Ranch were conveyed to a single purchaser in March of 2018. In conjunction with that sale, one of the co-applicants in 07CW133/134, "Elk River Ranches," conveyed its entire interest in the water rights decreed therein to Elk River Ranch Homeowner's Association, Inc. Also in conjunction with that sale, the purchaser was able to negotiate with the original developer for the completion of the recharge system. The recharge system was completed in May of 2018. Because the recharge system was completed by the developer, Applicants are not aware of the actual cost, but on information and belief, the cost estimate was approximately

\$15,000. A well permit for Horse River Pond No. 8 was obtained, and Horse River Pond No. 8 was constructed. The pond was constructed more than 200 feet from the permitted and decreed location. The decreed location will be corrected in a separate filing. —REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS— ON-BUS ADVERTISING

The Mountain Express Municipal Bus system is requesting proposals from individuals or businesses wishing to sell and install advertising inside Mountain Express vehicles.

The contract period is one year, October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019, with option to extend up to 5 years.

The winning contractor will be required to solicit

advertising; collect advertising revenues from advertisers; create placards for advertisers; create and make available hand-out maps; and install and maintain the advertising placards. The majority of advertising placards must be installed prior to November 15 of each calendar year, and Mountain Express will require payment from the winning contractor by December 31 of each calendar year.
