2025 PARADE:

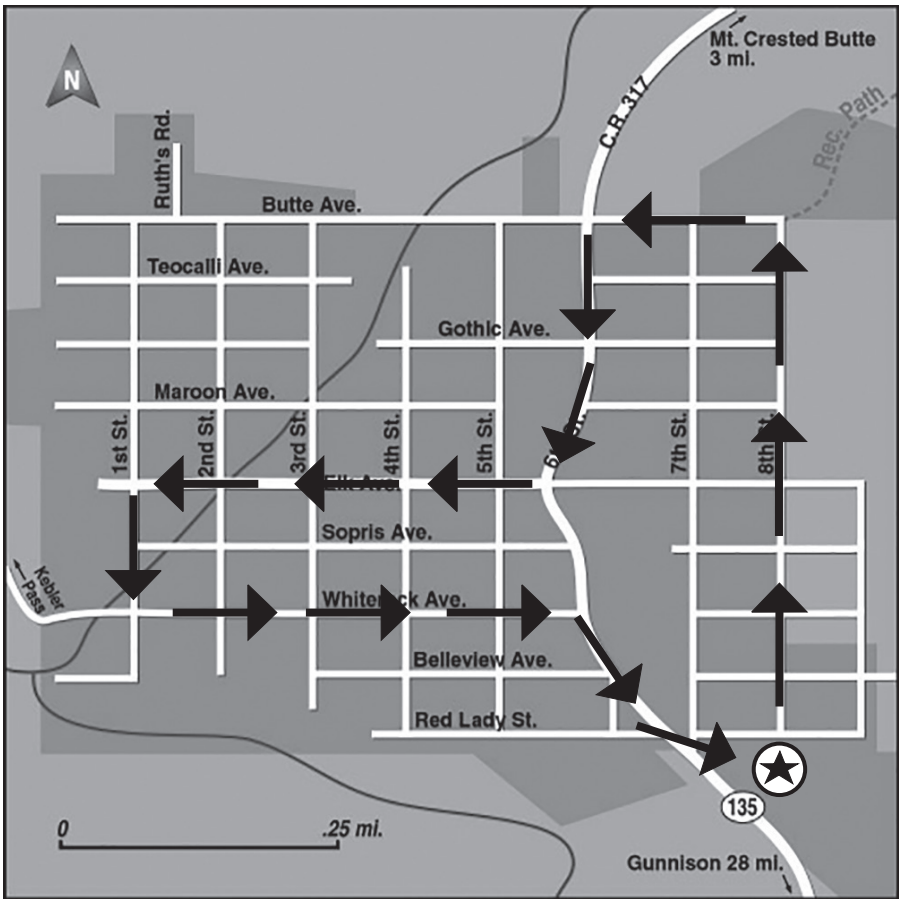
The Class of 2025 will begin their celebratory cruise through town at approximately 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, May 31. Come out and cheer them on!

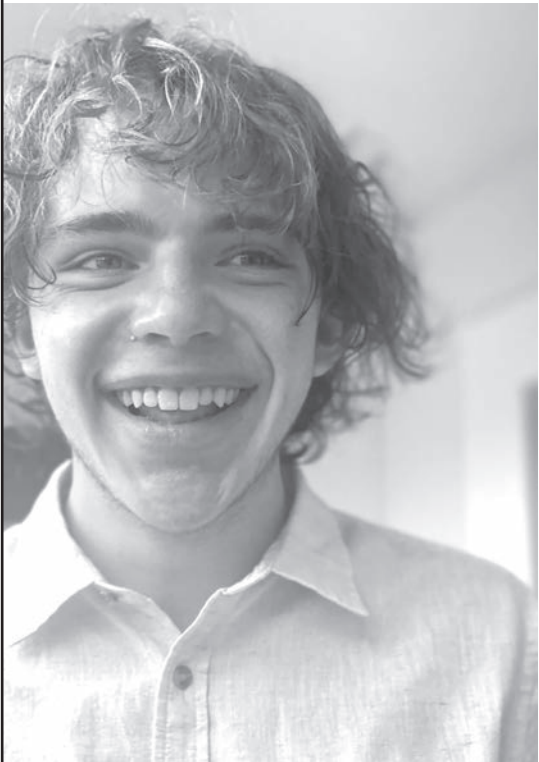
PARADE MAP

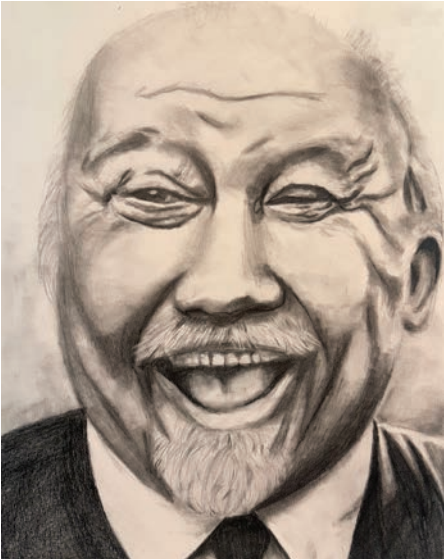

ARTIST STATEMENT

In my portfolio, I have been experimenting with human life and emotion. Using graphite I have created many portraits of different people and attempted to capture the life and emotions of each individual. Graphite has been my most used medium in my art journey. I have found it is my favorite medium when it comes to drawing people. People were the first things I learned to draw and what initially sparked my artistic interest. This portfolio takes the precise practice of portraits and realism and combines them with the creativity to find and illustrate the emotions or a glimpse into a person's life. I wanted to depict moments frozen in time in these portraits. The story of each individual is undefined and has endless possibilities, which is what I love so much about drawing people.

I began with creating a list of all of the emotions and or stories I wanted to portray in my work. I then found reference photos of the details I wanted to incorporate into the portraits and began to create. I left each background white to enhance the focus on the actual person in the portrait. This portfolio has been the best and most challenging project I have worked on, with trying to recreate these expressions and ensure the emotions play right on the face. I hope to do similar projects in the future with different mediums and experiment with different processes.



ARTIST STATEMENT

Bugs can't convey emotion, it is uncomfortable and foreign, but I hope to do just that by catching the viewer's attention with bugs who represent addiction. Drug addiction is a very large problem in our country. 40.3 million people face addiction in the US, that's 14.5% of our entire country. Using bugs to represent each addiction makes it feel more lively and colorful, but innately primal. We see the struggles of those who have or are currently facing addiction but they are not talked about enough to help those who aren't close to us.

Addiction has always been a part of my life and has inspired my healing journey to become the person I want to be. Addiction is real and it's a spectrum, addiction affects the community and country for the worst. I want this portfolio to open the minds of those who are not paying attention to the issue, especially those who have not been directly affected by addiction.

I use prismacolor colored pencils and watercolor paints to create my work, the pencils are wax, making it easy to layer watercolor on top without it smudging or bleeding the subject out. Watercolor gives the backgrounds a transparent feeling, it's also nice to layer and give the piece dimension and unique textures.

In every hallway at school, I will remember that I not only left my footsteps, but that I took away great lessons.
